


SR-9, FROM SPRINGDALE TO THE ZION NATIONAL PARK

The Utah Department of Transportation (UDOT) is fully reconstructing State Route 9 (Zion Park Boulevard) from Springdale to the Zion National Park gate. UDOT will also add wider sidewalks and designated bicycle lanes on both sides of the roadway throughout most of the town (with shared shoulders in the remaining areas) to heighten your experience with more pedestrian-friendly features. Our primary goal is to construct this project during the lowest visitation time-frame of October 2017 to April 2018.



What To Expect

We understand the importance of SR-9 to the community and how vital it is to keep traffic moving and access open. All businesses are open during construction and Zion National Park will remain accessible. While we will minimize impacts whenever possible, we also want you to be prepared for what to expect while visiting Springdale.

High visitation is expected for the Thanksgiving weekend:

- » Expect significant traffic delays (1 hour+) in Springdale over the Thanksgiving weekend. To reduce congestion, no work is scheduled but SR-9 remains reduced to one-way traffic with flaggers for approximately one mile in Springdale Town.
- » Parking is limited and delays at the park gate are expected to be significant. Zion National Park is providing free shuttles inside the park. All in-town shuttle stops are closed.
- » Limited overflow parking is available on Lion Boulevard. See map on reverse.
- » A paid shuttle is available from the Hampton Inn/Springhill Suites to the park entrance for \$2 per person.
